14 Chapter 1 Sets and **Probability** Empty Set The empty set, written as  $\emptyset$  or  $\{\}$ , is the set with no elements The empty set can be used to conveniently indicate that an equation has no solution For example  $\{x \mid x \text{ is real and } x^2 = -1\} = \emptyset$  By the definition of subset, given any set  $A$ , we must have  $\emptyset \subseteq A$  EXAMPLE 1 Finding Subsets Find all the subsets of  $\{a, b, c\}$
